The compulsory modules are:</i></p> <p><i>1) Chinese Bibliography, primarily Chinese literature within the research area, 7.5 credits</i></p> <p><i>2) Applied Palaeography, primarily documents and manuscripts from the modern era, 7.5 credits</i></p> <p><i>Furthermore, the course includes 1) one or several modules that aim to enable students to acquire specialised insights into the specific research area and 2) one or several elective modules of relevance for the thesis project.</i></p>
