Scandinavian Languages as a Research Object from Synchronic and Diachronic Perspectives, 7.5 credits Module 2. The Structure of Swedish and Other Scandinavian Languages, 7.5 credits Module 3. Text Analysis and Usage from the Point of View
		of Swedish, 7.5 credits Module 4. Mechanisms of Language Change and the History of the Scandinavian Languages, 7.5 credits The remaining modules, comprising a total of 22.5 credits, are to be selected in consultation with the supervisor/examiner. Higher education teacher training worth 3 credits may be included among the elective modules.
