4. | Course content

1. Brief description of the course and its content, including details of any subdivisions in the course.

This course begins with an overview of how ideologies can be understood based on different disciplines, including how the field of research has developed and which methods are used in the study of ideologies. The course focuses specifically on an examination in theoretical terms of the concepts of nationalism and communism, as well as on their emergence, development and contemporary legacies in East and South-East Asia. The course also addresses how actors in different countries in the region are influenced by each other, and how ideologies are adapted to local conditions. The history and contemporary manifestations of nationalism and communism in specific countries in East and South-East Asia are studied in more detail. The course also addresses specific national ideologies and newer ideologies and their development in the region such as Pancasila and populism. It also focuses on the manifestations of ideologies in political, social and cultural life and their impact on the individual's everyday life. This means that manifestations are studied including propaganda and how ideologies are conveyed in various media, including film and art, and in museums
