A few comments in italic.

Teacher's note:

As usual, a satisfying course evaluation for this beginner's course in history. A good turnout for the exam (38), and a few more planning to do the re-examination. The students gave even better group presentations than last year, and the home examinations are also of high quality. The adjustment in the time schedule to allow student more time to work on their essays seemed to have been a good idea. Also new for this year was less class-time for discussions in smaller groups, replaced by a hand-in. This seem to have made a slight improvement to the discussions in class.

The articles on the literature list were well read whereas the textbooks seem to have been used for reference only. Lars Lagerquist, *A History of Sweden* is out of print, and has been replaced by the new *A Concise History of Sweden* (Thomas Lindkvist et al). The new textbook seems to have worked well enough since it is less detailed and therefor more useful as orientation.

The weekly quizzes went down well, and so did an individual paper as a home examination. The information given on reading instructions, grading criteria and instructions for exam and seminars available at the course learning platform Luvit and in an information package are appreciated. In the oral course evaluation, the issue of having a long chronological time line from the Viking Age to the 21st Century, presented in a Nordic perspective, was discussed and the students seemed content with the choice of focus on a few periods and topics.

No major changes are necessary.
