At the **Department of Educational Sciences:**

1 doctoral studentship in Educational Sciences specialising in the history of schools and/or education (reg. no 54)

The history of schools and education focuses on learning, upbringing, education, educational reforms and teaching in a historical perspective. The discipline may specialise in social history and education, changing ideas on education or the location of education, debates and conflicts concerning education and the aims and significance of education or the organisation and ownership of education in national or international contexts.

1 doctoral studentship in Educational Sciences specialising in the sociology of schools and/or education (reg. no 55)

The sociology of schools and education focuses on schools and education (as empirically manifested in different forms) in a societal and social context. The sociology of schools specialises in the institutional context of schools and relates school phenomena such as social relations, learning and use of authority to the social and societal environment of schools. The sociology of education specialises in individual variations in education caused by social, economic and cultural factors such as class, gender and ethnicity.

1 doctoral studentship in Educational Sciences specialising in the professional practice of teachers and the scholarly development of teaching (reg. no 56)

The specialisation is linked to the educational science components of the MA/MSc programme in Secondary Education concerned with the professional practice of teachers and the scholarly development of teaching. Understanding the tensions and interplay between teaching experience and scholarly reflection in the everyday practice of teachers is an important aspect of the specialisation.

Eligibility

A person has *basic eligibility* for research (third-cycle) studies if he or she

1. has taken a second-cycle qualification
2. has completed course requirements of at least 240 higher education credits, including at least 60 higher education credits at second cycle, or
3. has acquired essentially corresponding knowledge in Sweden or abroad.

Special eligibility for research studies in each subject is specified in the relevant general syllabus, available (in Swedish) at <http://www.ht.lu.se/doktorand/allmaenna-studieplaner>.

Transitional provision: A person who fulfils the requirements for basic and special eligibility for admission to research studies before 1 July 2007 will also be considered to have basic and special eligibility for admission to research studies after that date.

Selection

The selection process will primarily take into account the applicants' ability to benefit from research studies. Before submitting an application, all candidates should discuss a potential research project with the subject representative or equivalent in the relevant subject.

Application

The application must be submitted on the form that is available at <http://www.ht.lu.se/doktorand/ansoekan-och-antagning>.

The application must include:

- records of first- and second-cycle studies (Ladok transcript or other transcript of courses and grades)
- first- and second-cycle theses/degree projects
- a list of other relevant administrative and educational qualifications
- scholarly journal articles, reports or papers of relevance for the subject
- where applicable, documented skills in a language of relevance for the research studies
- project proposal (1500 words max. excluding references)

Applicants who have already been admitted must submit an up-to-date individual study plan.

Only the application form in the original, no other documents, is to be sent to Registrator, Kansli HT, Box 117, 221 00 Lund. A copy of the application form and all documents referred to in the application are to be sent to the relevant department, as specified above.

The application, including attachments, must arrive by **Thursday, 1 March 2012**. The subject and relevant registration number(s) must be clearly indicated in the appropriate places. Applications are filed for two years, in accordance with the Swedish National Archives regulations.
