Application periods

- Autumn application period: deadline 5 October
- Spring application period: deadlines 5 March

How do I apply?



Admission requirements

General requirements

- Registered and active as a full-time student at Lund University at the time of application
- 30 credits at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology at the time of application
- Two full-time semesters at Lund University before the start of the mobility period
- Academic studies normally within humanities or theology
- Submit a preliminary study plan containing courses equivalent to full-time studies eligible for credit transfer
- Sufficient knowledge in the language of instruction



Admission restrictions

- Language courses may only be taken in a country where the language is the native language. The courses must be offered to the regular students (exception for Chinese, Japanese and Arabic)
- For studies in German, French, Italian, and Spanish – students normally need to have 60 credits at the time for exchange



Destination and choice of courses

- University information
- Look for courses at our partner universities' websites
- Check if there are any restrictions
- Show your study plans to your student counsellor and make sure that the courses are eligible for credit transfer

Documents to upload together with the application

- Preliminary Study Plan – one for each university
- Statement of Purpose – one for all choices
- CV
- Academic transcript from LADOK if you have studied outside LU
- All documents in English (except LADOK)
- Supporting documents in English or language of instruction (with Swedish translation)

Application

- Application is made online
- Max 5 choices
- List your choices according to preference



Nomination process

- Application will be sent to relevant department
- HT-International Office will receive a list of ranked students from each department
- HT-International Office makes the final nomination decision



Nomination decision

- Nomination letter with will be sent by mail to nominated students
- Reply via mail
- Nomination decision will be placed outside the International Office, SOL Centre



Application to the Host University

- Your coordinator will guide you through the process



Erasmus grant



- The Erasmus grant covers only extra expenses during your time abroad
- around 375 €/month – Austria, Denmark, Finland, France, Great Britain, Ireland, Italy, Lichtenstein, Norway
- around 315 €/month – all other EU/EES countries
- Apply online when you have been nominated at: www.lu.se/erasmus



Language test



- On-line language self-evaluation for all students – before and after mobility period
- Does not replace any obligatory language test, such as IELTS, TOEFL etc. test



Study Periods



- 12 months per study level (Bachelor, Master, Ph.D.)
- The time for studies and internship are added up for each level
- Time is counted retroactively, ie. those students who for example have already been away on Erasmus for 3 months within the old program have 9 months left within the new program
